On behalf of the more than 750,000 members and supporters of People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA), I am writing to ask that you help us convince Yum! Brands (Yum) to curb some of its practices that cause severe and often prolonged suffering to many animals. As a Yum board member, you are in a position to demand serious change.

For about two years now, PETA has been lobbying Yum to improve living and dying conditions for its chickens.
